During the 13 weeks of the course you will be working towards a class 2 licence, while being introduced to a range of skills for the driving industry.

You will concentrate on Class 2 Learners and Full as well as specific endorsements.

You will consider Health & Safety in the workplace and employer/employee responsibilities. You will also meet a range of local employers of drivers.

All students will have a learning plan that includes a variety of NZQA Unit Standards involving:

- Planning for the future
- Employment rights and responsibilities
- Produce a CV and cover letter

Who is eligible for free training?

This programme is free for Job-seekers who meet the *Work and Income* eligibility criteria .

Medical certificates

Medical certificates are usually required every time you apply for (or renew) a heavy vehicle driver licence. You don't have to present a medical certificate if you have done so within the last five years, and you sign a statement saying that any condition that you may have had hasn't worsened, and you haven't been diagnosed with any other condition since you produced the medical certificate.

Eyesight screening check

An eyesight screening check will be carried out each and every time you apply for (or renew) a driver licence, unless you present a certificate that states that your eyesight has been tested and is satisfactory.

What is the application process?

Drop into our local Work and Income Office to arrange an interview. Places are limited, so you should apply early. If accepted, you will be required to arrange a medical check, prior to the course starting.

We will not enrol students without the following:

- a Birth Certificate or passport
- a Clean Class 1 Drivers Licence for at least 6 months (no outstanding fines or high demerit points)
- Drivers medical completed or an appointment has been made for one.

All applicants must be prepared to accept Karoro Learning rules and policies and must agree to submit to drug testing if required (Any positive test for illegal drugs will result in instant dismissal from the programme).

We expect all trainees to be in fulltime employment by the end of the 13 weeks.

Travel Arrangements

For students in Hokitika, Cobden, Runanga or Dobson, we offer a courtesy pick-up and drop-off service to help you attend classes.

If we can't pick you up and you live more than 5km from Karoro Learning, a travel subsidy may be available to you to help meet your travel costs. (Discuss this when enquiring or enrolling)
